For more than 50 years, these two artists were united not only in marriage, but also in their obsession with the landscape and weather of Maine's Cranberry Island. Unfortunately, Bileck passed away shortly before this show opened, but his finely limned etchings of shorelines and rotted treetrunks still bristle with prickly vitality.

In opposition to his dry-eyed approach is Nelligan's moody tonalism. Her images, registered with charcoal and erasures on paper, capture the fleeting impressions of a sunset or a storm. What is most impressive in both artists is their focused discipline.
